MULTICULTURAL, MULTIRACIAL PHILOSOPHY STATEMENT

Kalamazoo Christian Schools (KCS) is committed to inspiring, challenging, and equipping our school community to live out the words of Micah 6:8: Acting justly, loving kindness, and walking humbly. As an expression of Christian obedience and global citizenship, Kalamazoo Christian Schools is committed to welcoming and embodying a representation of God's kingdom that is multiracial and multicultural.

Cultural and societal tension and inequity rooted in racial and cultural differences is a result of humankind's fall into sin. God's vision for the world is to reverse the curse of sin and to see all people reconciled to Him and to each other. The act of reconciling involves making changes—in ourselves and in our relationships—which bring about harmony and fellowship after a state of brokenness or dysfunction. Because we have received God's love, grace, mercy, and peace through Christ's reconciliatory act on the cross, we as a Christian community are called to reflect Christ's image by repairing the brokenness in the world. Since we have been reconciled to God, we should seek to be reconciled with others.

KCS has experienced and continues to experience ongoing transformation, in that God is always at work within and among His people, conforming them ever more to His image. As such, Kalamazoo Christian School commits to a welcoming, respectful, and loving place for all people regardless of their race and ethnicity or cultural and national backgrounds.
